Every Sunday for the past five years I have driven past Manchaca United Methodist Church on the way to my church. 

together? What was the process for choosing the books that were included? Can we trust that it's authority in our lives? Pastor David will continue to





kit comes with class materials as well as an online membership with access to more videos and tools.




Jesus: The God Who Knows Your Name

FLC RENOVATION UPDATE

From the Trustees:

Renovations of the Family Life Center continue to go well and are proceeding on schedule. Demolition in the FLC main room and restrooms is completed. In the main room, new LED lighting and all AV infrastructure has been installed in the ceiling. New 2x2 ceiling tiles have been installed and painted. Projectors, screen, stage lighting, and sound system speakers have been installed. Construction of the new storage rooms has been completed, and construction of the stage and sound booth will begin soon. Painting of walls and doors is beginning, as well.

In the restrooms, new LED lighting and ceiling tiles have been installed. Tiling has been completed, and wall painting is finished. Partitions and new sinks and countertops will soon be installed.

In the main building, layout plans and décor decisions are being finalized for the parlor and west side restrooms, main hallway, and hospitality area. Main hallway LED lighting and new 2x2 ceiling tiles will be installed around November 23rd. Completion of main building renovations is still scheduled for some time in January. "No Room at the Inn" Christmas Eve Offering

Again this year, our Christmas Eve offering will be dedicated to our Habitat for Humanity Methodist Build. This is when we join with other Methodist Churches in the area and help to build a home for a deserving family. The families are vetted based on need and ability to repay the loan.

Each family puts \$1,000 cash down on their homes and works off the rest of the down payment in 300 sweat equity hours building other's homes before they start on their own. When finished, the homes aren't free. Each family buys the home with a zero-percent, 30-year mortgage payable to Austin Habitat. Austin Habitat then uses those payments to build more homes.

It is very important that families are prepared for homeownership. The homeowners undergo rigorous education to improve their financial literacy. They learn to budget, manage and improve their credit, and plan for the future. When they complete their 300 hours of sweat equity, make a down payment on their home, and pay their monthly mortgage, they are empowered to be more financially independent. Responsible homeownership is one of the only vehicles available to lower income families to increase wealth and family stability.

Consider this:

- Owning a home not only enhances a family's financial independence but fosters a stronger community. Homeowners are 28% more likely to vote and 26% more likely to be involved in civic organizations like parent-teacher organizations. Ninety-three percent of Habitat homeowners take more pride in their neighborhood. One hundred percent of Habitat homeowners pay property taxes. AND 92% OF HABITAT HOMEOWNERS COULD NOT HAVE OWNED A HOME WITHOUT HELP FROM HABITAT.
- Austin Habitat is committed to providing affordable homeownership opportunities and it is the largest builder of homes affordable to own for hardworking, low-income families in Central Texas.
- Homeownership contributes to improved physical and psychological health including high satisfaction, self-esteem and control over their lives.
- Owning a home is a significant source of personal wealth and is the leading asset households can leverage to start businesses or finance college.
- Children who grow up in a stable home are 116% more likely to go to college.
- Housing costs continue to rise in Austin. The average rent increased 9% from \$1,235 to \$1,349 from 2018 to 2019. The median home price in Austin increased 10% from \$367,000 to \$404,298 from 2018 to 2019.
- Austin Habitat serves families with 30-80% of Median family income (\$37,850-\$75,500 for a family of 4)
- Over 34 years, Austin Habitat has built more than 470 affordable homes and repaired more than 340 homes.

Habitat gives families a hard-to-find opportunity and provides a chance for them to build something from the ground up that's theirs forever. They build it, earn it and pay for it! But not without you! Your generosity during the "No Room at the Inn" Christmas Eve offering will enable another deserving family to realize their dream of home ownership. The Kairos Prison Ministry

Kairos Prison Ministry is an ecumenical ministry that serves incarcerated men and women as well as the staff at correctional institutions in Texas, the United States, and many countries. The four day weekend offers the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to those who have made bad decisions in their life and are repaying their debt to society. Many of the women and men have had challenging lives and may never have had a relationship with God through Christ or the relationship became broken or distant from God.

<u>From Sharon</u>: Kairos is an incredible ministry - I pray that many more prisons would offer Kairos. Building a Christian community in prison can only happen through willing volunteers and the power of the Holy Spirit. I have witnessed miracles on many occasions and have felt the amazing power of the Holy Spirit in me and have seen Jesus working in the lives of many incarcerated women. I have seen how lives have been transformed as the ladies begin to break down their walls of shame, guilt, and anger and allow the love and joy of Christ inside.

This past October I was serving the Lockhart Women's prison. There were two participants who had a simmering conflict before the weekend. By the end of the Kairos weekend they had agreed to resolve their difference and forgiveness began. What they learned through the weekend of God's mercy, forgiveness, and love allowed them to see one another in a new light. They became a new creation and now have Christian tools and faith to help each other and those in the prison community.

A really big part of the Kairos ministry is Prayer and Share. This is the continuing effort to grow the Christian community. Prayer and Share happens every Saturday (and can only happen as long as there is at least one free world volunteer) attending. It is two hours of fellowship, study, and prayer where the participants support and encourage each other. Much like an accountability group.

<u>From Ron</u>: This past October I served a men's Kairos at the Luther Unit in Navasota. One of the memorable events of the weekend was the prayer chain. Leading up to the weekend the volunteers offer their churches to participate in the weekend through posters, place mats, purchase meal tickets, financial contributions and the prayer chain.

The prayer chain is colored slips of paper (about 1 inch wide by 4 inches long) with a person's first name and the town they live in. By signing the slip of paper you are participating in the Kairos weekend through your prayers during the weekend.

The slips of paper are formed into paper chains and are presented during the second day of the weekend along with posters and a talk titled "You Are Not Alone." The inmates are told that each "chain" in the prayer chain represents the prayers that are being offered on their behalf by those who want only the best for each of the inmates and their families. There are hundreds of prayers in the prayer chain and it has a powerful effect on the men and women. The men at my table were speechless and several had tears as they watched the chain circle around the room. They had no idea that someone they didn't know or will most likely never meet would offer up prayers on their behalf. It is truly an amazing experience and has a lasting affect on the inmates.

What's the Pastor Up To?

Basically, I was a beginning seminarian, but I had no clue what a pastor did with his/her time. So I was looking for clues even if they were from 60 years earlier!

Have you ever wondered what a pastor does? Here is an overview of my weekly schedule.

Monday- Do Hospital visits, hold staff meetings, and do research on the following week's sermon.

<u>Tuesday</u>- Teach Bible Study in the morning and the evening. Do research for the studies. Go to Akins at 3 to help with the tennis team.

<u>Wednesday</u>- Meet with community pastors for breakfast. Teach Bible Study at Village on the Park at Onion Creek. Mentor at Menchaca Elementary. Do Homebound visitation. More research.

<u>Thursday</u>- Write this week's sermon and work on next week's. Visit the hospital. Meet pastors whom I mentor/encourage for lunch. Go to Akins at 3 to help the tennis team.

<u>Friday</u>- Spend time with family. Celebrate a Sabbath from late afternoon until late afternoon Saturday. <u>Saturday</u>- Go over the sermon for Sunday.

In summary, pastoring our church, teaching to develop disciples, volunteering with schools, and encouraging other pastors are the priorities of my life in addition to my family.

By the way, if this wasn't helpful, I can give you the name of a great book from 1930!
